Eddie W.'s Early Days

As I mentioned in the April Scoop, Eddie W. got sober in the Antelope Valley in 1961 and went to meetings here for about two years before he moved to the San Fernando Valley. Here is another installment from his own writings:

My name is Eddie W.; Coming back from a three-day bender in 1960, being sick and tired of being sick and tired, I remember seeing a personal ad in the local paper that read "if you think you have a problem with alcohol call this number _____

This was the number of Loren S. He was part of a small roving AA group that met, like a lot of early groups did, in members' homes. There were about five people at a typical Friday night meeting. They were all much older than me and they had a general feeling that I was not ready because I still had a watch, car, wife, etc. I was 28 years old.

After five or six meetings with them and another nine months of

drinking, Loren told me there was a group of younger people meeting in Lancaster that might be better suited to me. After another hard siege of drinking, I knew what I had to do. (continued on page 3)

Step Five

"Admitted to God, to ourselves and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs."

All of AA's Twelve steps ask to deflate our egos. When it comes to ego deflation, few Steps are harder to take than Five. But scarcely any Step is more necessary to longtime sobriety and peace of mind than this one.

A.A. experience has taught us we cannot live alone with our pressing problems and the character defects which cause or aggravate them. If we have swept the searchlight of Step Four back and forth over our careers, and it has revealed in stark relief those experiences we'd rather not remember, if we have come to know how wrong thinking and action have hurt us and others, then the need to guit living by ourselves with those tormenting ghosts of yesterday gets more urgent than ever. We have to talk to somebody about them.

The 5th Tradition

"Each group has but one primary purpose – to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers."

"Shoemaker, stick to thy last!" ... better do one thing supremely well than many badly. That is the central theme of this Tradition. Around it our Society gathers in unity. The very life of our Fellowship requires the preservation of this principle.

Alcoholics Anonymous can be likened to a group of physicians who might find a cure for cancer, and upon whose concerted work would depend the answer for sufferers of this disease. True, each physician in such a group might have his own specialty. Every doctor concerned would at times wish he could devote himself to his chosen field rather than work only with the group. But once these men had hit upon a cure, once it became apparent that only by their united effort could this be accomplished, then all of them would feel bound to devote themselves solely to the relief of cancer. In the radiance of such a miraculous discovery, any doctor would set his other ambitions aside, at whatever personal cost.

Daily Reflections excerpt on the 5th Step

Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs. 12 & 12, p.55 Since it is true that God comes to me through people at a distance I also keep God at a distance. God is nearer to me than I think and I can experience Him by loving people and allowing people to love me. But I can neither love nor be loved if I allow my secrets to get in the way.

It's the side of myself that I refuse to look at that rules me. I must be willing to look at the dark side in order to heal my mind and heart because that is the road to freedom. I must walk into darkness to find the light and walk into fear to find peace.

By revealing my secrets, and thereby ridding myself of guilt, I can actually change my thinking; by altering my thinking, I can change myself. My thoughts create my future. What I will be tomorrow is determined by what I think today.
