I did not pick this day or date, nor did I know what importance it was to represent, to me, for me, but it is my date.

I wasn't supposed to live this long ... I was supposed to die in some lonely place where the "normal" people wouldn't go. I grew up with the thought in the back of my mind "Live Fast, Die Young, and Look Good." But you see, that didn't happen.

I grew up thinking that every household, behind every front doorstep, all who lived there, consumed, some level of alcohol and drugs, it was the norm in my house, getting loaded with mom and dad. That's how I grew up, could roll a joint by the age of 7.

I continued on, making fast friends and living fast, I remember my dad making a "deal" with me, when I was 13 years old, not to "smoke dope" outside the house till I was 16, that lasted about 2 days.

I met this kid in my HS metal shop one day, he told me he raced motorcycles, and didn't know it but was the first guy to introduce me to beer. I had my first real drink at his house, and..... I hated the taste, but sure loved what it did to me, and so it was on, to have a life full of alcohol and drugs.

I could go on, and on, but now wish to talk about the gratitude, of my life, as it got to a point where I just couldn't go on anymore, I was getting arrested, jail time, court dates, lawyers, red lights in the rear view mirror ONE MORE TIME! Sheesh, where did they come from?

I was subjected to one of "Those meetings" when I was 21, and finally fell to my knees when I was 29, and so, on the morning of Dec. 19th, 1986, I rolled out of bed, and fell to my knees, screaming, crying and begging out loud, "Please, if there is a god, please, don't let me use drugs or drink alcohol for just ONE day!" That was 30 years ago this morning.

I write this with tears of gratitude in my eyes. For I am ever so grateful for the life I received but didn't think that I deserved. I got so much more, and could go on. I learned how to write the correct date on a check.

I want to thank everyone for being a HUGE part of my story, so many of you, and a lot of you have no idea how or when you saved my life, but you did. Mike, Tony, Mark, Dave, Shelia, Nancy, Mom & Dad, Cory, Cary, Bob, Ben, Erin, John, Vickie, Christi, Brenda Marty, Alabam, Jack Dave, Vince,

Roger, Beverly, Kim, Francis, Don, Peggy, Brett, Bobby, Carl, Amy, Rose, Jorge Doug, Tom, Eddy and soooooo many more, it is astounding. If you read your name, you know who you are.

Thank you for all the life adventures bills, deaths, mortgages, gas, water electric, horsepower, racing, dirt bikes, falling from heaven into my truck, and so much more.

#### Step 2

"Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity."

The moment they read Step Two, most A.A. newcomers are confronted with a dilemma, sometimes a serious one. How often have we heard them cry out, "Look what you people have done to us! You have convinced us that we are alcoholics and that our lives are unmanageable. Having reduced us to a state of absolute helplessness, you now declare that none but a Higher Power can remove our obsession. Some of us won't believe in God, others can't, and still others who do believe that God exists have no faith whatever He will perform this miracle. Yes, you've got us over the barrel, all right-but where do we go from here?"

Let's look first at the case of the one who says he won't believe-the belligerent one. He is in a state of mind which can be described only as savage. His whole philosophy of life, in which he so gloried, is threatened. It's bad enough, he thinks, to admit alcohol has him down for keeps. But now, still smarting from that admission, he is faced with something really impossible. How he does cherish the thought that man, risen so majestically from a single cell in the primordial ooze, is the spearhead of evolution and therefore the only god that his universe knows! Must he renounce all this to save himself?

At this juncture, his A.A. sponsor usually laughs. This, the newcomer thinks, is just about the last straw. This is the beginning of the end. And so it is: the beginning of the end of his old life, and the beginning of his emergence into a new one. His sponsor probably says, "Take it easy. The hoop you have to jump through is a lot wider than you think. At least I've found it so. So did a friend of mine who was a one-time vice-president of the American Atheist Society, but he got through with room to spare."

# The 2<sup>nd</sup> Tradition

"For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern."

Where does A.A. get its direction? Who runs it? This, too, is a puzzler for every friend and newcomer. When told that our Society has no president having authority to govern it, no treasurer who can compel the payment of any dues, no board of directors who can cast an erring member into outer darkness, when indeed no A.A. can give another a directive and enforce obedience, our friends gasp and exclaim, "This simply can't be. There must be an angle somewhere." These practical folk then read Tradition Two, and lean that the sole authority in A.A. is a living God as He may express Himself in the group conscience. They dubiously ask an experienced A.A. member if this really works. The member, sane to all appearances, immediately answers, "Yes! It definitely does." The friends mutter that this looks vague, nebulous, pretty naïve to them. Then they commence to watch us with speculative eyes, pick up a fragment of A.A. history, and soon have the solid facts.

When alcohol influenced every facet of my life, when bottles became the symbol of all my self-indulgence and permissiveness, when I came to realize that, by myself, I could do nothing to overcome the power of alcohol, I realized I had no recourse except to surrender. In surrender I found victory over my stubborn resistance to life as it was given to me. When I stopped fighting anybody or anything, I started on the path to sobriety, serenity and peace.

Traditions," G.S.R.'s become familiar
with the A.A.'s Third Legacy- our
spiritual responsibility to give service
freely. They are usually elected to serve
