The AV Men's Stag moved from the Palmdale Cultural Center to the Courson Park Pool Building in Palmdale in late 1992 or early 1993, and there it stayed for several years, until one night Gary W. and his son Sean were standing outside the building talking with Cowboy Eddie and a shot rang out. Eddie got shot in the ass! Dave P. (who later became cake person for the stag) says he heard someone say "cowboy hat" before the shot was fired. Anyway, Eddie was all right, but the meeting real quickly moved. A room was found at the Family Resource Center, upstairs, at the corner of Palmdale Boulevard and 15th Street East. The dates of the move are still a bit unclear, but the meeting was definitely there

in June, 2001. How much before and after that date, we're not sure. That move from Courson Park to Palmdale Boulevard began a bunch of short-term contingency locations before the AV Men's Stag finally ended up at the Grange in Quartz Hill, where it is today (to be continued)

Food For Thought for People of AA

Donations to AA are small compared to the number of people in the meetings. Although I know some are just getting back on their financial feel and must make financial amends, some are just passing through for the courts, there are others that have been doing well for a long time. In some meetings I have known 1 to 3 people to be 20% to over 50% of the donations to the meeting of 20 to 30 or more participants. Too many people still hold to the \$1.00 to \$2.00 donations if they donate at all. Here is some of the costs to go out and drink that we would have no problem coming up with the money for. For those who did the better living through chemistry course you can add the cost of those other drugs you would use based on your usage. These are the sale prices (not the full price) at my local Albertson's except for the quarts of beer. 9.00- 6 pack Coors 11.00-12 pack Pabst 9.00-15 pack Keystone Lite 19.00-30 pack Rolling Rock 22.00- 30 pack Miller 13.00- 12 pack of Budweiser 31.00- 18 pack Corona

3.00- Various quart bottles(Food/Gas markets)20.00- Various 12 packs of hard seltzers

For you wine and liquor people I used the prices on a 75-milliter bottle which is .75 liter or approximately .79 quart (not a full quart) based on conversions. 6.00 to 19.00 each bottle for wine 9.00 to 24.00 bottle of liquor Restaurant and Bars 5.00 to 15.00 or more per drink I think many of us could up the ante a little bit if we look at what we would be paying to drink. Just something to think about for the next time the basket is passed, drinking the way we did is not a \$1.00 to \$2.00 a day problem it shouldn't be a \$1.00 to \$2.00 a meeting solution.

Step 3

"Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God <u>as we understood Him.</u>"

Practicing Step Three is like the opening of a door which to all appearances is still closed and locked. All we need is a key, and the decision to swing the door open. There is only one key, and it is called willingness. Once unlocked by willingness, the door opens almost of itself, and looking through it, we shall see a pathway beside which is an inscription. It reads: "This is the

way to a faith that works." In the first two Steps we were engaged in reflection. We say that we were powerless over alcohol, but we also perceived that faith of some kind, if only in A. A. itself, is possible to anyone. These conclusions did not require action; they required only acceptance.

Like all the remaining Steps, Step Three calls for affirmative action, for it is only by action that we can cut away the self-will which has always blocked the entry of God – or, if you like, a Higher Power – into our lives. Faith, to be sure, is necessary, but faith alone can avail nothing. We can have faith, yet keep God out of our lives. Therefore our problem now becomes just how and by what specific means shall we be able to let Him in? Step Three represents our first attempt to do this. In fact, the effectiveness of our whole A.A. program will rest upon how well and earnestly we have tried to come to "a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him."

To every worldly and practical-minded beginner, this Step looks hard, even impossible. No matter how much one wishes to try, exactly how *can* he turn his own will and his own life over to the care of whatever God he thinks there is? Fortunately, we who have tried it, and with

equal misgivings, can testify that anyone, anyone at all, can begin to do it. We can further add that a beginning, even the smallest, is all that is needed. Once we have placed the key of willingness in the lock and have the door ever so slightly open, we find that we can always open it some more. Though self-will may slam it shut again, as it frequently does, it will always respond the moment we again pick up the key of willingness.

The 3rd Tradition

"The only requirement for A. A. membership is a desire to stop drinking."

Early intolerance based on fear. To take away any alcoholic's chance at A.A., was sometimes to pronounce his death sentence. Membership regulations abandoned. Two examples of experience. Any alcoholic is a member of A.A. when *he* says so.

This tradition is packed with meaning. For A.A. is really saying to every serious drinker, "you are an A.A. member if you say so. You can declare yourself in; nobody can keep you out. No matter who you are, no matter how low you've gone, no matter how grave your emotional complications – even your crimes – we still can't deny you A.A. We don't want to keep you out. We aren't a bit afraid you'll harm

us, never mind how twisted or violent you may be. We just want to be sure that you get the same great chance for sobriety that we've had. So you're an A.A. member the minute you declare yourself."

To establish this principle of membership took years of harrowing experience. In our early time, nothing seemed so fragile, so easily breakable as an A.A. group. Hardly an alcoholic we approached paid any attention; most of those who did join us were like flickering candles in a windstorm. Time after time, their uncertain flames blew out and couldn't be relighted. Our unspoken, constant thought was "which of us may be the next?"

Third Concept:

As a traditional means of creating and maintaining a clearly defined working relation between the groups, the Conference, the A.A. General Service Board and its several service corporations, staffs, committees and executives, and of thus insuring their effective leadership, it is here suggested that we endow each of these elements of world service with a traditional "Right of Decision." effective conscience of our whole Society in its world affairs."
