OPEN DOOR HISTORY (installment 2)

So the two of them (Ike W. and Mary Lou), in 1981, set out to find a new location for meetings. Some say it was Ernie M. who helped them locate the small room behind a shoe repair shop at 45141 Yucca Avenue. It was so small there wasn't enough room to set up a table, just chairs lined up along the cinder block walls and a small 2ft x 2ft cabinet they used for supplies and a coffee pot on top. Someone said if you got more than five people in the room you couldn't turn around.



The room was located behind a shoe repair shop and was 15ft by 16ft minus a 5ft by 5ft bathroom, and because of the shop in front, you could only enter from the

back door. And so, on July 9, 1981, the Back Door came into existence.

Bobbie M. was one of the earliest members that I could get facts from regarding the early days. Bobbie got sober in August, 1981, about a month after the Back Door opened. She remembers you could purchase one of the cinder blocks that made up the walls and have your name, sobriety date, and favorite phrase painted on it for \$10. That ended when someone with a resentment painted lines over the blocks, but that is the origin of the current sobriety plaques at the Open Door.

Today [written in 2016], over 100 plaques hang on the wall, and reading them we are reminded of our friends who used to be here. Some have moved, some have passed away, and some we have lost track of.

It is the consensus of most everyone that the Back Door drew the low bottom crowd in the beginning (to be continued).

Steps ask us to go contrary to our

deflation, few Steps are harder to

longtime sobriety and peace of

A.A. experience has taught us we cannot live alone with our pressing problems and the character defects which cause or aggravate them. If we have swept the searchlight of Step Four back and forth over our careers, and it has revealed in stark relief those experiences we'd rather not remember, if we have come to know how wrong thinking and action have hurt us and others, then the need to quit living by ourselves with those tormenting ghosts of yesterday gets more urgent than ever. We have to talk to somebody about them.

Page 289 – When Conflicts Mount
